CONFIDENTIAL

1. The purpose of this document is to provide a comprehensive overview of the current state of the project and to identify the key challenges that must be addressed in order to ensure its successful completion.

2. The project has made significant progress since its inception, with several key milestones having been achieved. However, there are a number of areas where the project is currently lagging, and these must be addressed as a matter of priority.

3. The primary challenge facing the project is the lack of sufficient resources to complete the work on time. This is due to a combination of factors, including budget constraints and a shortage of qualified personnel.

4. In order to overcome these challenges, it is necessary to develop a detailed action plan that outlines the specific steps that must be taken to secure the necessary resources and to ensure that the project is completed on schedule.

5. It is recommended that the project manager should immediately initiate discussions with the relevant departments in order to secure the necessary resources and to ensure that the project is given the highest priority.

PREFACE

This list gives brief details of some 206 accounts of Nottinghamshire folk plays and related customs which I had either collected, found in libraries or had pointed out to me up to 1975. These details were recorded using a card index, and although material has come to light since 1975 I have not tried to continue the index because better methods of abstracting and indexing folk plays are now available. Folk play researchers hope to create a computerised file of folk play data covering the whole of the British Isles, to which new material should be added. Unfortunately, at the time of printing it is not possible to give any further details of this. I have therefore decided to publish my 1975 index as an interim measure.

This is a fairly basic list, and some of the information, especially the bibliographic information, is unavoidably incomplete. In the geographical listing, if a piece of information is missing then usually this means that it has not been mentioned in the original record. In the bibliography, missing details usually mean that I have not been able to trace a copy of the original publication.

I want to thank the many people who have helped me in my search for information on Nottinghamshire folk plays. In particular I would like to thank the staff of the Local Studies section at Nottingham Central Library, (especially Sheila Cooke and Stephen Best) who have been very accommodating in helping me to trace obscure local publications. I would also like to acknowledge the help and general encouragement received from fellow folk play researcher Paul Smith of the University of Sheffield.

Definitions

Play - Self explanatory

Sword dance - A ring dance in which the dancers are linked to each other by swords or sticks

Mumming custom - A custom where the participants go from house to house collecting money, but with no play. In retrospect this is an uninformative and confusing term. "House visiting custom" would have been better.

Plough trailing custom - A custom where a decorated plough is taken round the village

Numerical designation - This means that characters are given numbers or number-like names in speech designations (e.g. No. 3 Actor) even though they may be given proper names in the dialogue.

Unnamed characters - This means that one or more characters are mentioned but not actually named in the account. In the character lists, either the role of these characters is given in brackets, or just the character's number (where numerical designations have been used).
